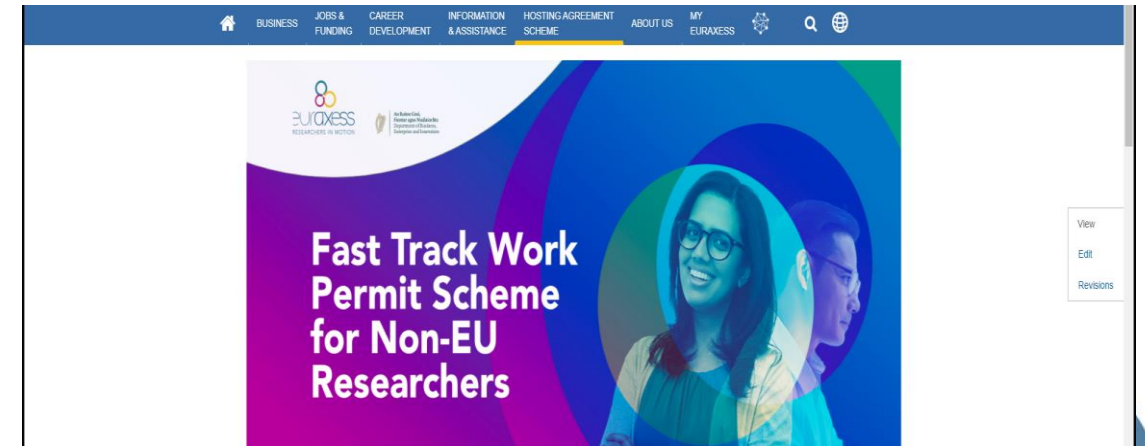
As an organisation the IUA is committed to:

EURAXESS manages Hosting Agreement/Fast track immigration scheme for non-EU researchers employed in Ireland

- Over 5000 researchers from outside EU got the HA approved (590 in 2023 to date)
- All research areas/university or industry
- You must have an employment contract with accredited institution
- Quick and easy – EURAXESS immigration support for free



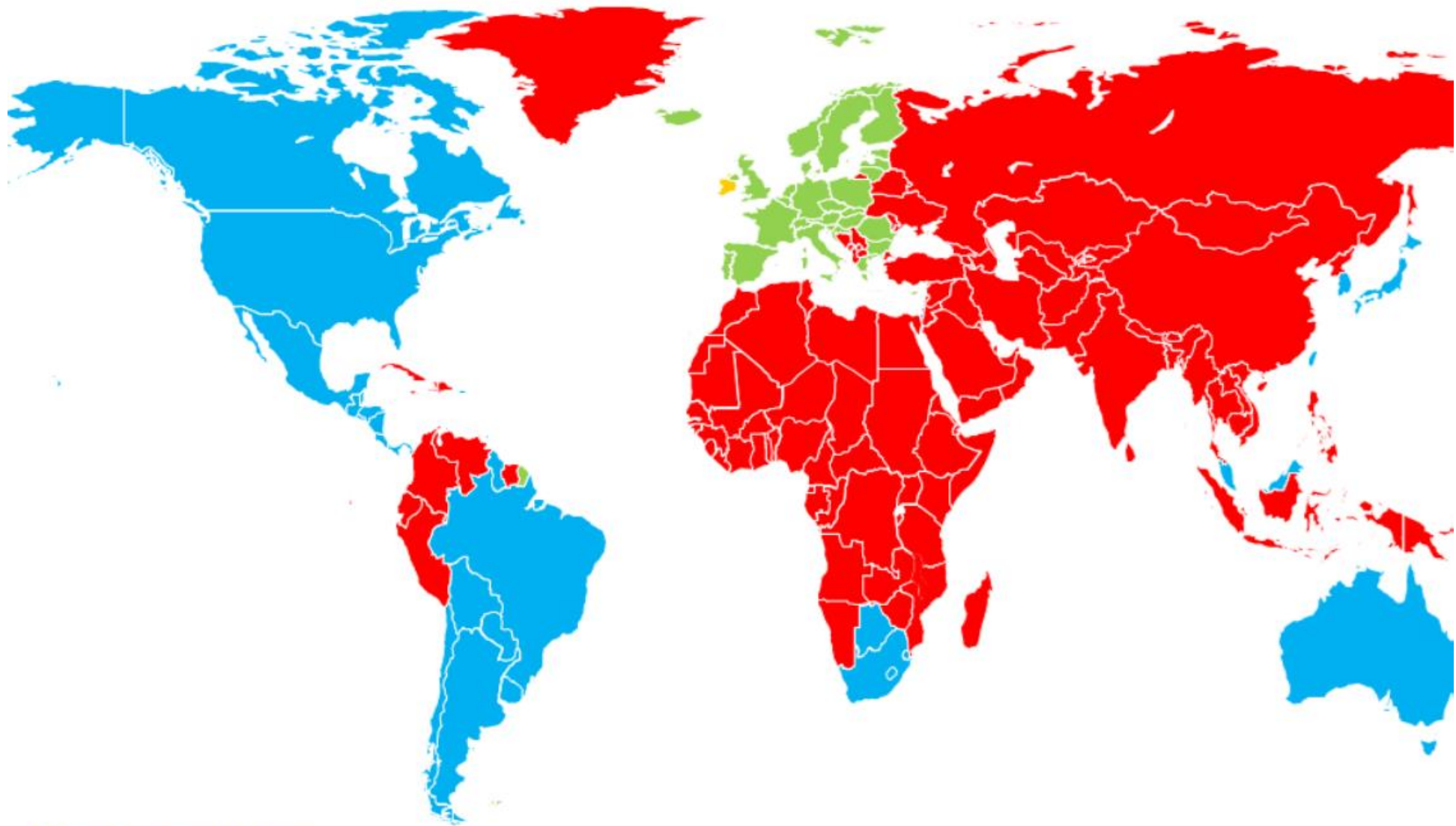

Green countries: no immigration requirements to live/work in Ireland (EEA countries)

Blue countries: no visa to enter Ireland, but need permit to work in Ireland

Red countries: need visa to enter Ireland and permit to work in Ireland

What is the Hosting Agreement scheme, and why we have it in Ireland ?

- Third Country Researchers Directive Council Directive 2005/EC/71 is designed to address so called '**Pillar 1**' – **An adequate flow of competent researchers with high levels of mobility between institutions, disciplines, sectors and countries**
- Ireland's ability to attract high quality researchers has been a key element of our national strategy



What is the Hosting Agreement scheme, and why we have it in Ireland ?

- The Directive provides for a fast-track procedure (**Hosting Agreement**) for admitting persons from countries outside of the European Economic Area to carry out a research project with an accredited research institution.
- **They will not require a separate work permit.**
- The procedure for accreditation of research organisations is currently managed by the DFHERIS
- Once accredited, research organisations may issue Hosting Agreements to third country researchers directly



What is the Hosting Agreement scheme, and why we have it in Ireland ?

- EURAXESS Ireland of the Irish Universities Association (IUA) manages the operation of the Hosting Agreement scheme on behalf of DFHERIS
- The agreements are process online – a designed processing database for accredited institutions



Qualification Criteria for the Hosting Agreement scheme

- Research employment contract issued by an accredited institution for min **91 days must be in place** for all new agreements
- € 23,181 salary pa for researchers without families in Ireland
- €30,000 salary pa for researchers with at least 1 family member in Ireland (only spouses/de facto partners and children qualify)

EURAXESS Ireland HOSTING AGREEMENT SCHEME



Hosting Agreement – for visa required nationals –documents needed

Evidence of **medical or travel insurance** does not need to be provided with your application. However, the visa officer may request it before they make a **decision on your application**

If your visa is approved, you must have evidence of **medical or travel insurance** when you arrive at the port of entry (airport/seaport) and must present it to the immigration officer on request.

For renewals, the insurance requirement is not required.

Guide to supporting documentation
Your signed and dated Application Form and the appropriate fee (where applicable) must be accompanied by the supporting documentation set out below.

ⓘ If you do not submit the required documentation your application may be refused on the basis of insufficient documentation.

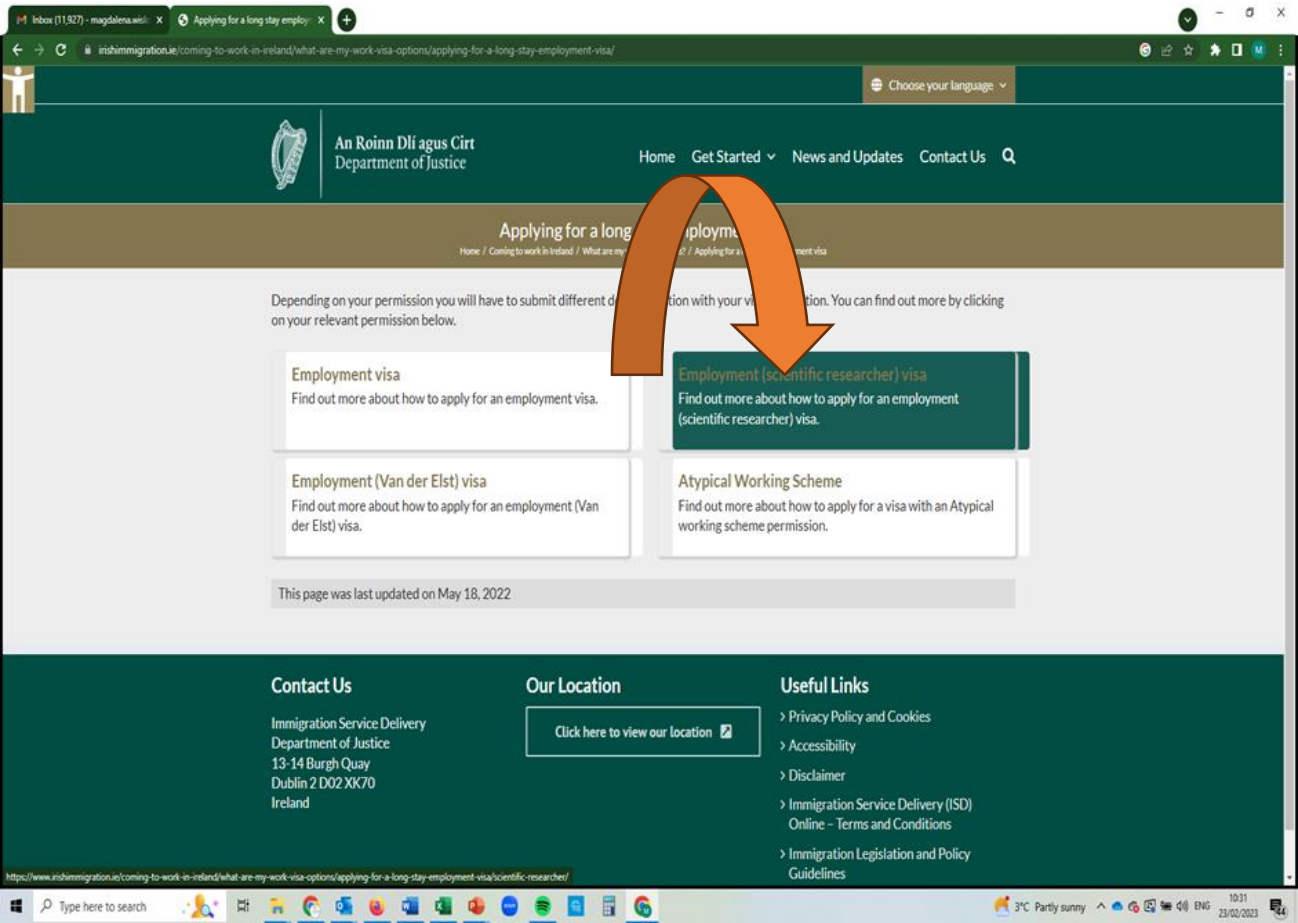
- Two colour passport sized photographs not more than 6 months old
- A signed letter of application that includes
- Finances
- Copy of hosting agreement
- Copy of contract of employment
- Medical or travel Insurance
- Previous Visa Refusals

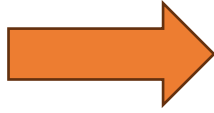
COOKIE SETTINGS

"Any State issued official documents, such as Birth Certificates, Marriage Certificates, Death Certificates, Divorce Certificates that were issued by a State outside of the EEA or Switzerland, must be attested/apostilled as genuine by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in the State that issued the document, in order that it can be accepted as evidence for Irish visa purposes. Such documents are required to be translated into English or Irish, if necessary. Translations done outside the EEA or Switzerland must also be attested/apostilled as genuine, by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in the country in which the translation occurs. Send us both the original documents and the certified translations.


Hosting Agreement Online System

Where to locate HA (scientific visa) info on the INIS web ?



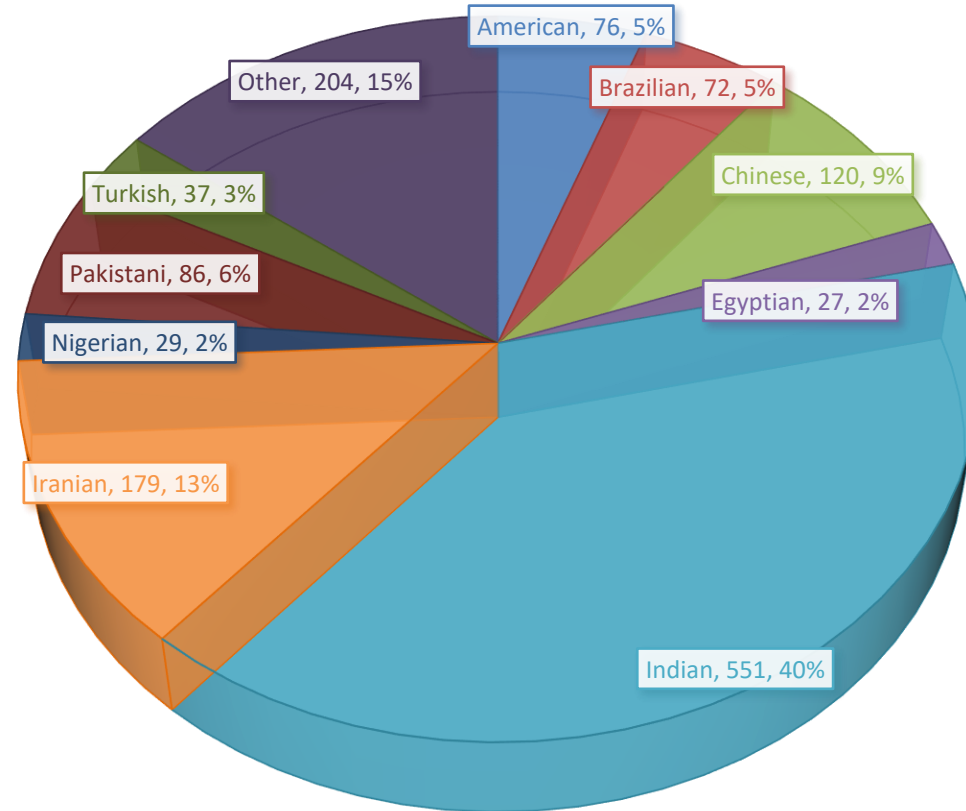


Employers issuing Hosting Agreements

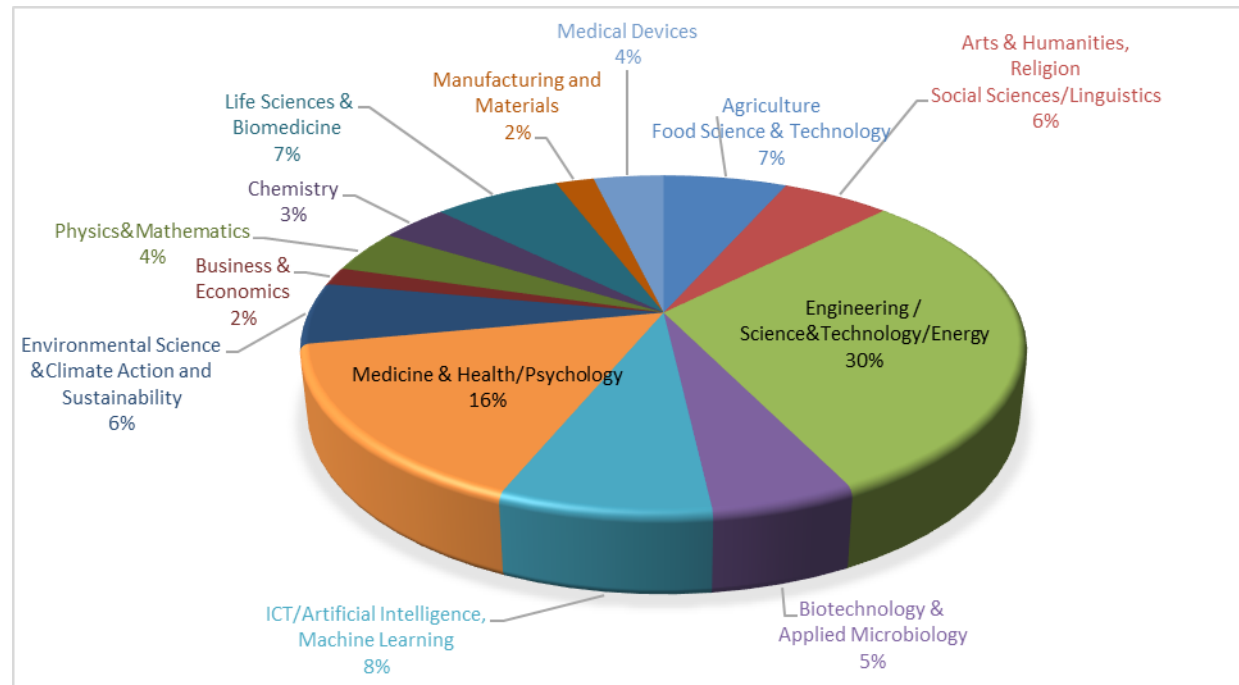

GNIB registrations for non-EU/EEA

- **Are you residing in Dublin ?**

- ✓ ISD registers permissions in Dublin city and county
- ✓ First time: in person/original docs
- ✓ Next time: online Renewals – scanned copies

- **Are you residing outside the Dublin area?**

- ✓ GNIB is responsible for registrations outside Dublin
- ✓ First time: in person/original docs
- ✓ Next time: also, in person/original docs
- ✓ Renew your card at your local Garda Síochána District Headquarters Station. To find out where your District Headquarters Station is, contact your [local Garda Station](#).

The registration fee is €300 (per person). You can pay this fee by credit or debit card only



Third Level Graduate Scheme

An award must be granted by a recognised Irish awarding body

Required documents

- A copy of the award granted to you
- Your passport
- Medical insurance
- You must pay a fee of €300 per person to register
